Headstones

Over the years, some of the older headstone have been broken and pieces strewn. We are endeavoring to locate and repair these stones, so that once again they will be standing as permanent "fixtures."

ALWAY, Sarah

White marble headstone imbedded horizontally on a cement base. In memory of Sarah beloved wife of George Alway; born Oct. 31 1800 in Portsea England; who died Dec. 24 1836, at age 35 years 10 months and 7 days And thou are sanctified.” (on reverse side is a hand with the index finger pointing heavenward)

“She was a faithful and consistent member of the First Baptist Church in Lobo.

ALWAY, Jane

white marble headstone imbedded horizontally on a cement base
In memory of Jane, beloved wife of George Alway who died January 13 1847 at age 39 years

“To the stranger: on this tablet we can convey
an adequate idea of the virtue worth and piety of her
who sleeps beneath. A truly affectionate wife and a loving
stepmother who daily directed the children in her charge (sic) to the lamb
of God that taketh away the sin of the world the manifested
(next line has transverse crack running through, therefore illegible)
...and grace of God in her deeply..... Was marvelous to all present her
consistent life and triumph in death is her best epitaph.”
J.A. (foot marker at foot of cement base)

ALWAY, Jane daughter of George and Isabella Alway

White marble headstone lying horizontal embedded in cement base
In memory of Jane daughter of
George and Isabella Alway, who died Oct. 2 1849 aged 21 months and 3 days.
“The cup of life just to her lips she pressed,
Found the taste bitter and declined the rest
Averse then turning from the face of day
She sweetly breathed her little self away”.

BECKWITH, William R

2 top portions of a white marble headstone.
In memory of William R. Beckwith (broken) died April 20 1876 age 62 yrs. (Rest is missing)

BEDGEGOOD, Hester, wife of Thomas Bedgegood

white marble headstone; “In memory of Hester wife of Thomas Bedgegood who died May 20 1856 ages 70 years.”

“Call me not back to Earth
To lose my crown.
I’ve fought with sin and death
The victory’s won. (Foot stone lose at base)

CHALLONER, Irene Lillian Died Oct. 18 1975

CHALLONER, Blance Jessiman Died Jan. 01 1984

CHALLONER, Sarah wife of George Challoner

white marble slab, urn among willow motif at top. In memory of Sarah wife of George Challoner died Aug. 25 1847 aged 31 years
(Foot stone lose at base) R.M. J.D.

CHALLONER, Neville

North east side of rust, grey and black granite obelisk
In memorandum Neville R. Challoner died Oct. 2 1873 aged 57 years
“Yea, though I walk through
the valley of the shadow of death
I will fear no evil; for thou art with me:
Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me.”

Elizabeth Jane beloved wife of the above died Mar. 18 1879 age 57 years and 6 months

James H. son of Neville and Jane Challoner born June 23 1854 died Aug. 10 1921 at rest and his wife Marie S. died Mar. 9 1896 age 36 years and 3 months at rest

North west side

In memorandum **Annie Elizabeth** adored wife of James H. Challoner died Sept. 30 1888 age 19 years 6 months.
“A precious one from me has gone,
A voice I loved is still,
A place is vacant in my home
Which never can be filled.
God in his wisdom has recalled
The boon his love and given;
And though the body moulders here
The soul is safe in heaven.”

Southwest side

Neville B. son of James and Mary Challoner born Aug. 1 1886 died Feb. 22 1941.

Southeast side

Elizabeth daughter of Neville R. and Jane Challoner died Sept. 14 1849 age 7 years 7 months

White marble markers lying by monument

COLVER, Hannah wife of Thomas Finch

In memory of Hannah Clover (broken) beloved wife of Thomas Finch who died Sept. 1876 age 89 years.
“A tender parent loving friend
She’s gone and left us here below
But soon must we that voice attend
That called her from this world of woe.”

COAKLEY, William and wife Mary

Two parts of broken white marble headstone
Gone but not forgotten in memory of Mary wife of William Coakley died June 14, 1869 age of 57 years
4 months.

“Dearest wife thou has left us,
Here thy loss we deeply feel,
But t’is God that hath bereft us,
He can all our sorrows heal.”

Headstone lying behind 2m. top two portions of a white marble headstone
In memory of William Coakley died Aug. 18 1876 age of 73 years
“Affliction sore long time he had

Physician were in.....
Till God did (piece broken off and missing)

DRAKE, John

Weathered white marble headstone, hand with index finger pointing upward, above it is carved “Gone Home”; broken in 2
pieces.

In memory of John son of Samuel and (broken) Ann or Jane Drake died Feb. 5 1848 aged 1 month and 19 days.

EDWARDS, Henry and wife Salome

3 parts; white marble headstone Sacred to the memory of Salome wife of Henry Edwards Native of Canada born July 25 1807
died Jan 7 1837

“...is come and calleth to thee
The dust and ruins that remain
Are precious in our eyes
The ruins shall be built again
And all that dust shall rise.”

White marble headstone in two parts. Sacred to the memory of Henry Edwards native of Somersetshire, England born Jan. 20
1798 died May 1857.

“Christ said, I am the resurrection and the
life, he that believeth in me, though he were
dead; yet shall he live; Believeth thou this.
Yes! Yes! Yes !

EDWARDS, Charles H.

Brown and grey mottled granite headstone; “E” boundary marker on all four corners of headstone.
In Memory of Charles H. Edwards born Aug. 25 1848, died Mar. 25 1896.

EDWARDS, Jennie, wife of Alfred West Edwards

Died May 19 1953 at rest. Also two infant children of C.H. and M. Edwards.
We will meet again

EDWARDS, Alfred West
Born 1864 and died 1939

EDWARDS, Alfred J. and Maria children of Jeremiah and Sarah Edwards

Maria Edwards

small, white marble headstone Maria daughter of Jeremiah and Sarah Edwards died Aug. 2 1853 aged 1 year 10 months and 4 days.

“God in his wisdom has called
The precious boon his love has given
And though the casket moulders here
The gem is sparkling now in heaven.”

EDWARDS, Alfred

small white marble headstone. Alfred son of Jeremiah and Sarah Edwards died Aug. 13 1853 aged 4 years old 8 months and 21 days.

“this lovely bud so young and fair,
Called hence by early doom
Just came to show how sweet a flower
In Paradise could bloom.”

Huge salmon granite monument EDWARDS written on it.

In memory of Emily wife of Henry Fares died Jan. 25 1867 age 54 years


White marble headstone

FINCH, Thomas

In memory of Thomas finch died Oct. 13 1873 age 89 years 2 months

“Dearest parent thou hast left us
Here they loss we deeply feel
But tis God that hath bereft us
He can all our sorrows heal.”



FINCH, Jeremiah

white marble headstone in 2 pieces.
In memory of Jeremiah Finch who died May 3 1855 aged 67 years
“ I see thee still,
Thou art not in the grave confined
Death cannot claim the immortal mind
Let earth close o’er its sacred trust;
But goodness dies not in the dust
Then my wife it is not me
Beneath the coffin lid you see
I to a fairer world have gone;
There let me hope my work is done
Singing now the victory is won,
With saints and angels round the throne.” (Verse badly weathered)

FINCH, Ida Rosetta

white marble headstone
In memory of Ida Rosetta daughter of George and Violetta (sic) Finch died Feb. 17 1866 age 2 years
2 months and 23 days
“Sleep on sweet babe,
And take thy rest
God called thee home
He thought it best.

GUSTIN, Eliphalet

Brown and black and grey mottled granite headstone.

Eliphalet Gustin, born Sept. 18, 1800 died May 1, 1893

Sarah Ann wife of Eliphalet Gustin born May 18 1805 and died Feb. 14 1850

John A Gustin, son of Eliphalet and Sarah Ann born March 17 1839 and died April 22 1881
Marker) MOTHER

LIVINGTON, Dugald and wife Margaret

White marble headstone
In memory of **Dugald Livingston** who died Feb. 5 1887 aged 73 years Native of Argyleshire, Scotland

“Father thou are gone to rest,
I will not weep for thee;
For thou are now, where oft on earth
They spirit longed to be”.

White marble headstone
Gone but not forgotten in memory of Margaret wife of Dugald Livingston died May 4 1882 ages 73 years Native of Argylesdire
Scotland

“She was a tender mother here
and in her life the Lord did fear
We trust our loss will be her gain
And that with Christ she’s gone to regin”.

Discolored white marble headstone
In memory of John son of Dugald and Marg. Livingstone died July 17 1879 age of 8 years
“In life beloved and death lamented.”

McCONNELL, Violetta wife of H. McConnell

white marble headstone

Who departed this life April 30 1868 aged 48 years. I know that my redeemer liveth.

McINTYRE, Elizabeth wife of Hugh McIntyre

white marble headstone with cross-like arrow at top pointing up, visage of angel below it.

In memory of Elizabeth wife of Hugh McIntyre (sic) died Nov. 19 1883 aged of 29 years.

“The spirit is not dead,
Though low the body lies’
But freed from sin and sorrow,
To dwell beyond the skies.”

McINTYRE, Hugh

Large 12 foot black and gray granite monument,
urn draped in mantle on top, large letter M’s
engraved on each face beneath that about
inscriptions.

North east side, in memory of Hugh McIntyre died
September 5th 1899 aged 81 years, 8 months and 7
days.

I am the resurrection, and the life. He that
believeth in me, though he were dead yet shall he
live. John 11:25

McINTYRE, Hugh Jr.

Died May 4th 1923 aged 75 years 2 months.

McINTYRE, Louisa E. wife of Hugh McIntyre

Died June 10th 1852 aged 26 years, 5 month and 16
days. Also their children **Mary** born and died May
17 1842, **John** born April 29 1850 and died Jan.
17 1851, **Selinda** born April 22 1852 and died June27 1852.



Northwest side

Mary of Hugh McIntyre born Jan. 29 1854 died Nov. 6 1919.

“She was a tender mother here,
And in her life the Lord did fear;
We know our loss will be her gain,
And that with Christ she’s gone to reign”.

South-west side

McIntyre, Janet B. wife of Hugh McIntyre died Oct. 8th 1869 aged 38 year, 11 months and 29 days also their child Jessie L.
born Sept 15th 1867 died Oct. 8 1871.

Footstones: FATHER (at foot of grave, north east side of monument; presumable Hugh Sr.) MOTHER (marker to east of
monument)

McINTYRE (carved below inscription on southwest face)

MOTHER (footstone marker west of monument, 6’ to northwest of other)

Markers North of monument is Janet, Jessie, Mary, Louise, Selinda and John McIntyre lot cornerstone right of Selinda’s
marker.

McINTYRE, N.C.

white marble headstone flat in ground, motif at top of carved monument between two willow trees.
In memory of N.C. McIntyre died Feb. 10 1862 ages 39 years

McINTYRE, Mary

Died April 4 1862 ages 28 years

MITCHELL, Sarah and William

Sarah Ann Mitchell Born 1829 Died Jan. 27 1890 age of 61 years 10ms.

White marble headstone; clasped hands, Gone but not forgotten in memory of Wm. MITCHELL, Died Dec. 13 1879 aged 39 yrs. 10ms, Sarah Ann MITCHELL died Jan. 27 1890 age 61 yrs 10ms

“In the silent tomb we leave thee,
Till the morn when Christ appears.
Then, with joy we hope to meet thee,
Far beyond this vale of tears.”

Small footstone W.M Rock - north corner of cemetery

MITCHELL, George husband of Christena (West)

“M “ (lot corner marker on east, north-west and south corners of Mitchell plot) (red, granite stone on grey granite base)
(double bar and flowers carved in upper left corner)

(south-east face) MITCHELL.

(north-west face) “Woodman of the World emblem in left corner. George F. Mitchell born 1862 died 1947. His beloved wife Christena (West) born 1860 died 1948. Markers: FATHER MOTHER

PATTERSON, Jessie B (mother) and daughter Jessie

Sacred to the memory of **Jessie B. Patterson**. Died Feb. 26 1859 age of 29. Rest of inscription cannot be read as stone is heavy to lift; white marble headstone 8” thick, fallen over. Also daughter Jessie died July 9 1859 6 months.

ROBINSON, Thomas H, wife Alwylda

Alwylda H. wife of Thos. H. Robinson born June 29 1863 died April 15 1947.

Thomas Robinson born June 24 1858 died March 25 1954.

(two white marble posts indicate a walkway or the remains of an enclosure around a grave.)

ROHRER, Mary Ann wife of John Rohrer

White marble headstone. Sacred to the memory of **Mary Ann** the beloved wife of John Rohrer who died Jan. 11 1853 aged 36 years.

“Farewell my kind husband said she
know from your kind bosom I leap.
With Jesus my bridegroom to
My flesh in the tomb for to sleep.”

RHOHRER, James and John Henry (sons of John and Mary Rohrer)

Small white marble headstone. **James** infant son of John and Mary Rohrer died Feb. 17 1843
also **John Henry** their son died July 26 1849 aged 1 year and 9 months.

ROLSTON, Elizabeth

White marble headstone with top portion broken off,
In memory of **Elizabeth** beloved wife of **John Rolston** died April 21 1865 age 21 years

Top portion of a white marble headstone; smaller stone in front of 2- A
may be the top portion of 1-A

“God took thee in his mercy
He fought the fight for thee,
He won the victory

SMITH, David D. Smith

Tall grey and blue mottled granite headstone. (northeast side)
In loving memory of **David D. Smith** died May 3 1900 at aged 60 years old.

“Although he sleeps in memory doth
live, and cheering comfort to his
mourners give.”

SMITH, Prudence Maud Rosella

Ornate, carved, white marble headstone.

Little **Prudy** gone to Heaven. In memory of **Prudence Maud Rosalla** beloved daughter of David and Harriet Smith died July 26 1872 at the aged 9 years 5 months and 14 days.

“O she was fine and lovely too,
An angel in disguise,
Sent to this earth to live a while.,
Then join the angles in the skies”.

SMITH, Corbet Milford

weathered, small white marble headstone. How desolate our home bereft of thee **Corbet Milford** the beloved son of David and Harriet Smith died June 10 1868, age 2 years 8 months and 6 days.


“A little flower of love

SMITH, Robin

white marble monument with statue of woman putting flowers on grave marked with a cross.
Love's Remembrance.

(North east side) **Robin** son of Henry and Olive Smith born Jan. 6 1903 and died Mar. 28 1927. Husband of Lucy Bell Smith and Father of Carmen Smith.

“Arise, shine, for thy light is come, and the glory of the
Lord is risen upon thee.



WATTS, Elizabeth wife of Richard Edwards

white marble pedestal south east side

In memory of **Elizabeth Watts** wife of Richard Edwards died Oct. 30 1848 71 years 2 months 20 days.

“And I heard a voice from Heaven
saying unto me, write. Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth
yea, saith the spirit, that they may rest from
their labors, and their works do follow them.”

WATTS, Richard Edwards husband of Elizabeth Watts

North side in memory of **Richard Edwards** died Nov. 5 1863 age 90 years 6 months and 3 days

“Father thou art gone to rest,
Thy toils and cares are o'er
And sorrow, pain and suffering not?
Shall ne'er distress thee more.”

WEISHUHN, James and Jane

Inscriptions side by side

In memory of **Elizabeth Jane** wife of James Weishuhn died Apr. 5 1873 age 79 yers

“Dearest mother thou has left us,
Here they loss we deeply feel;
But the God that hath bereft us,
He can all our sorrows heal.”

In memory of **James Weishuhn** died April 14 1876 age of 76 years

“The winter of trouble is past
The storm of affliction are o'er (sic)
My troubles are ended at last
And sorrows and death are no more.”

WHEALON, Sarah and William

white marble headstone leaning on back of 7C. **Sarah** daughter of William and Ann Whealon died
May 20 1848 age 10 months and **William B.** son of the same died Nov. 10 1851 age one year 1 month.

“Where the grassy hillock rises
There our lovely infants sleep;
Nothing now can hurt or harm them
Jesus doth their ashes keep.
